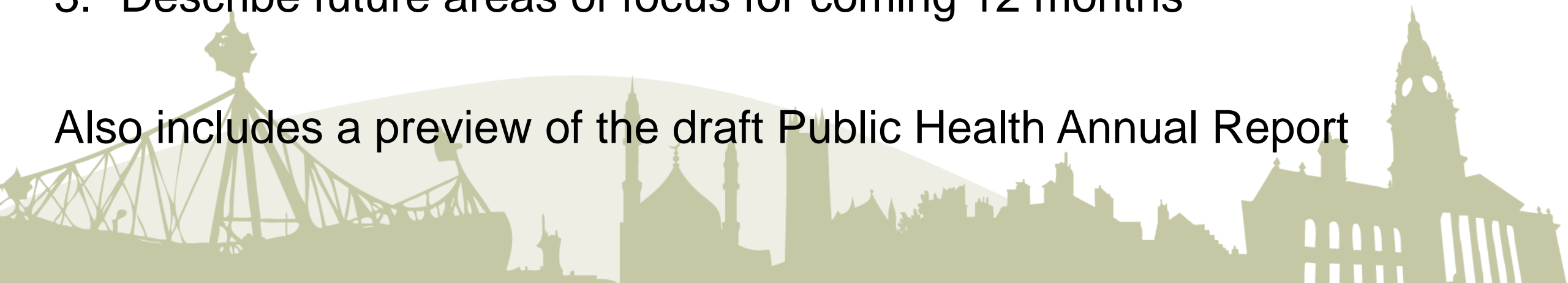
BOLTON JOINT STRATEGIC NEEDS ASSESSMENT

We have robust arrangements in place to meet our statutory duties

- Statutory responsibility of Health & Wellbeing Board (part of Active Connected Prosperous board in Bolton)
- An assessment of the current and future health & care needs of the local community
- Delivery is overseen by the Executive Intelligence Group, strengthened by the Bolton Research and Intelligence Network (BRAIN)
- Bolton approach is much broader than some JSNAs – demographics, economic and social context, community views & assets
- Intended to inform policy and priorities across all ACP and Locality
- No set format or minimum datasets – Bolton's is a website

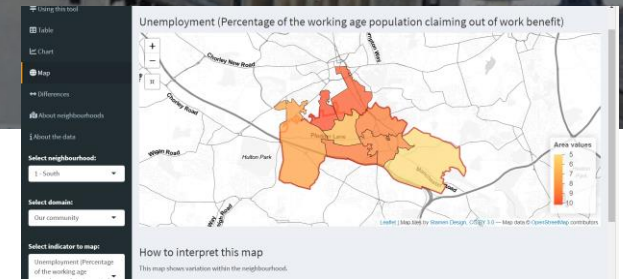

- Resource for completing Equality Impact Assessments

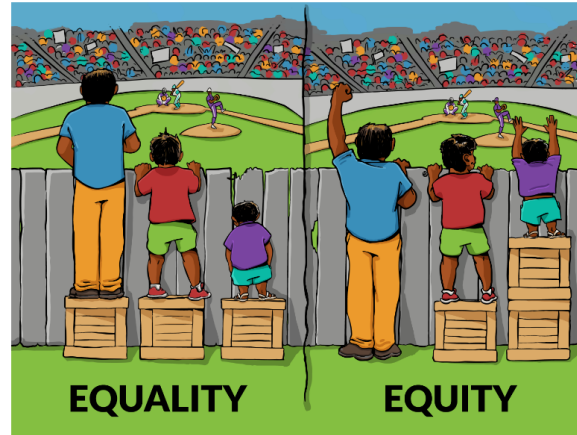
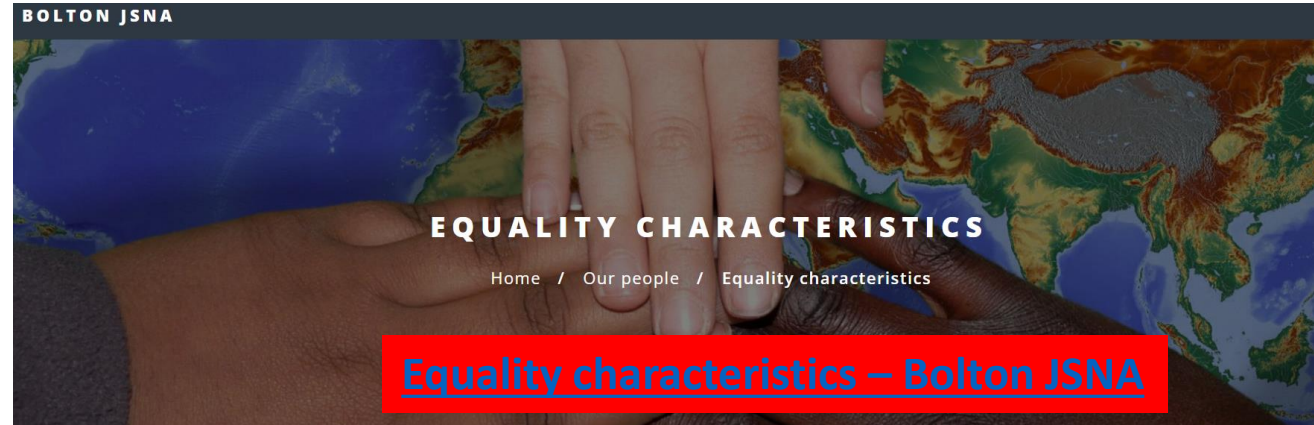

Climate

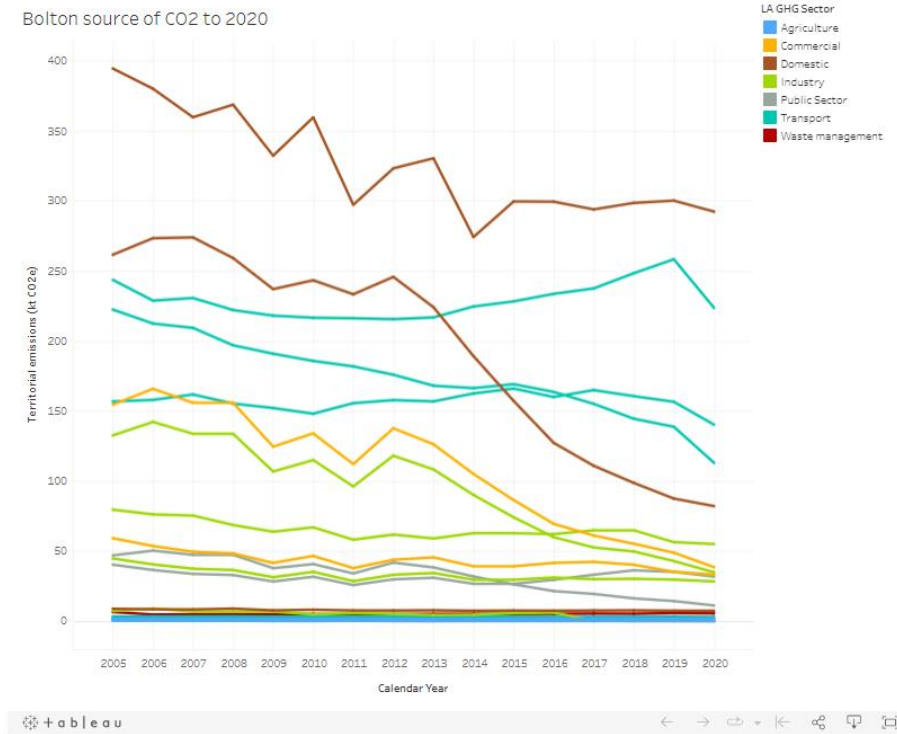
What is it

Climate – Bolton JSNA





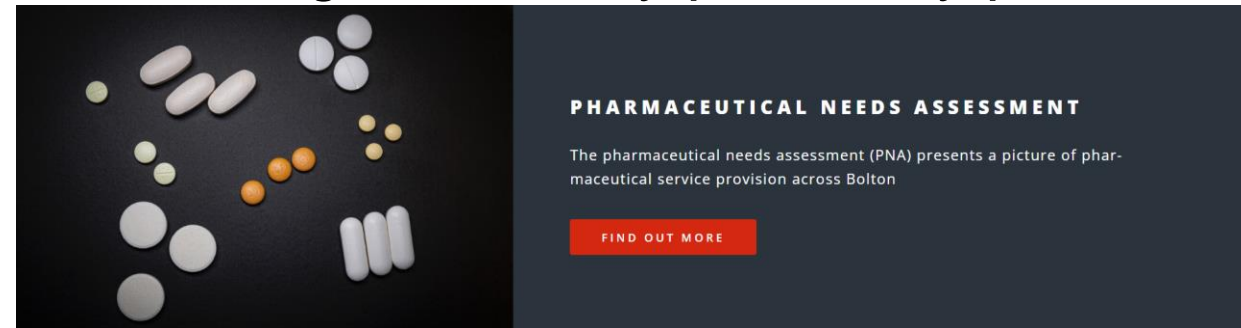
Pharmaceutical needs assessment

What it is

- Assesses provision of pharmaceutical services across Bolton
 - Are they appropriate for population needs?
 - Are there gaps in current provision?
- Different statutory responsibility to that of the JSNA
- Draws on similar sources
- 3 year life from 1st October 2022
- Bolton's is published on JSNA website

What does it add

- Statutory assessment for NHS England informing community pharmacy provision

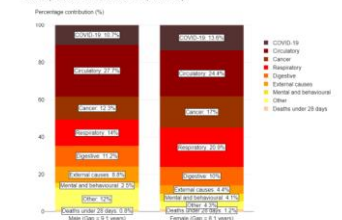
Figure 1: Bolton's Integrated Care neighbourhoods

Figure 15: Breakdown of the life expectancy gap between the most and least deprived quintiles of Bolton by cause of death, 2020 to 2021 (Provisional)¹⁷



Public Health England's segment tool provides an understanding as to the major causes of death that are contributing to the differences in life expectancy between Bolton and England (Figure 15). The biggest contributors to this life expectancy gap for males are circulatory disease (heart disease and stroke), respiratory disease (flu, pneumonia and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease) and cancer. Similarly for females the biggest contributors to this life expectancy gap are circulatory disease, followed by respiratory diseases and digestive disease (chronic liver disease and cirrhosis). COVID-19 was a slightly bigger contributor to the gap in life expectancy for females (13.6%) than males (10.7%).

6.2 Mortality and disease
Mortality is the number of deaths, in general or specific to a cause, in a particular population. It is specifically used as a rate to measure the number of deaths on a large scale (in this case per 100,000), which is calculated to allow comparison between different population sizes and demographics.

What does it add

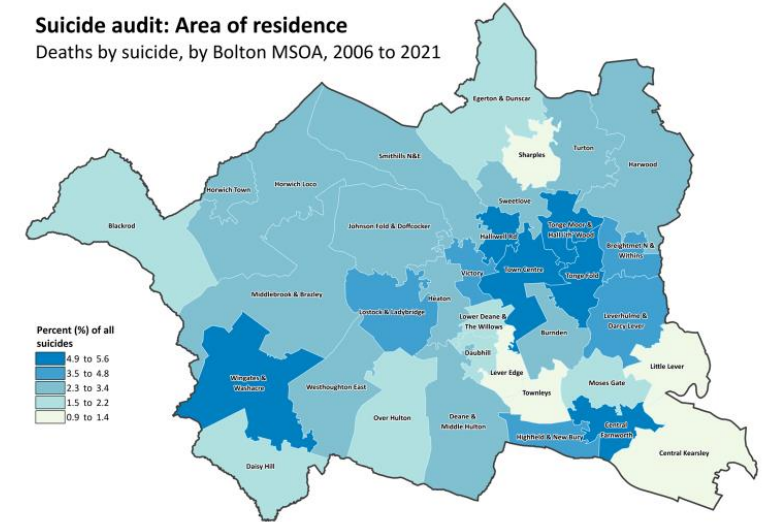
- Different format for people who prefer to see & hear than read
